

## CHAPTER I INTRODUCTION

### A. Research Background

English is a language spoken by several individuals throughout the world.<sup>1</sup> Over the last three decades, English has evolved into the most important international language around the world.<sup>2</sup> This is what makes English one of the languages that must be learned in schools or in institutions. It also qualifies English as a primary requirement for communicating in global communication. Meanwhile in Indonesia, English is still considered a foreign language, even though it is strange to most of people. In addition, which is English not an official language, Indonesians still use local languages in their everyday lives. There are many explanations why English is hard to understand. it might be difficult for undergraduate students to speak English.<sup>4</sup> Proper method application is required to support successful achievement.

Such matters as work and education also require that we be fluent in listening English. For example, the listening class was seldom conducted there; it was just conducted two or three times in a month. There are many kinds of strategies in teaching listening. One of them is using podcasts. The term ‘podcast’ was first coined in 2004, and it is defined as an internet audio publishing. The audio recording is designed to be downloaded and listened to on a portable MP3 player of any type, or on a personal computer. Different from other audios, podcasts are delivered online automatically via website. Those offers language teachers and students a wide range of possibilities of extra listening practices both inside and outside of the classroom.

A podcast is a type of media file that can be transmitted over the internet and replicated on mobile devices and computers such as iPods.<sup>11</sup> A podcast is a digital sound (or video) file, which is generated and downloaded for sharing purposes on an online platform.<sup>12</sup> Podcast allows users to alter time and place contents so that a listener can adjust to the podcast that they want as and when they want.<sup>13</sup> Podcasting is a type of m-learning in which an audio or video broadcast system is used to listen or watch.<sup>14</sup> Listening to podcasts can be done more flexibly and may also be done in other ways. It’s different from reading a book that has to be done casually and can’t do anything else. Through the podcast, people can easily hear things they just want to know. The podcast listening can
